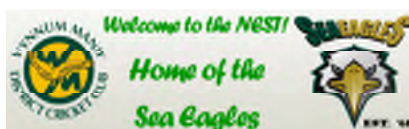

Lost firstst innings by 32. Then had a crack second innings got to 4 fa 200 then put them back in to try and get an outright.

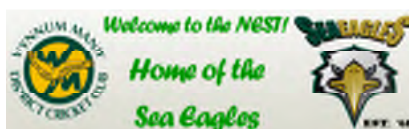
Ran out of time though. Nilas 8fa for the match. In the second innings Treadwell 55 Deano 53 Sichter 44

Harrison top scoring with 84 fantastic runs, Prosser again in the 50's and Jake Hunter and Connor Carroll both making runs.

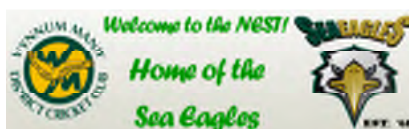
Much improved performance and great to hear Scott and Joel leading the team song in fine voice.

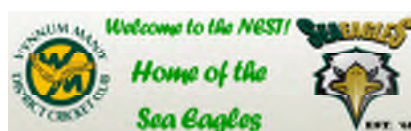
The Fantasy League is great fun and lets every player in the club play the role of Chairman of Selectors, and pit your selection skills against everyone else in the club.

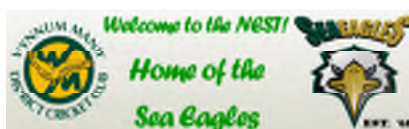
