Results from the weekend as follows:-

First Grade

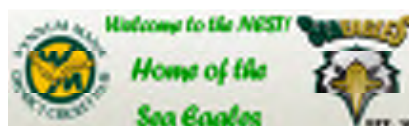

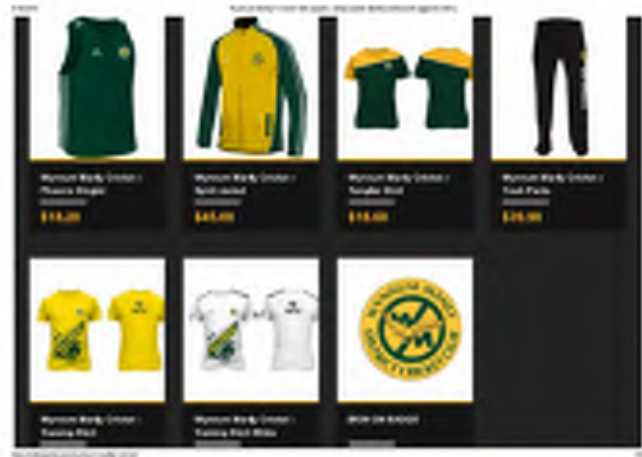
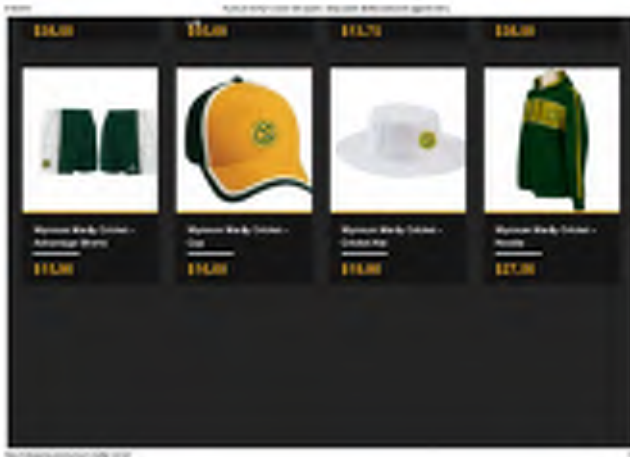
