Sunday – Game 1

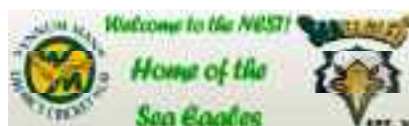

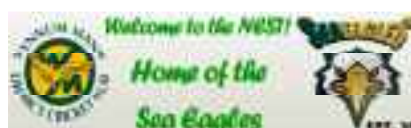

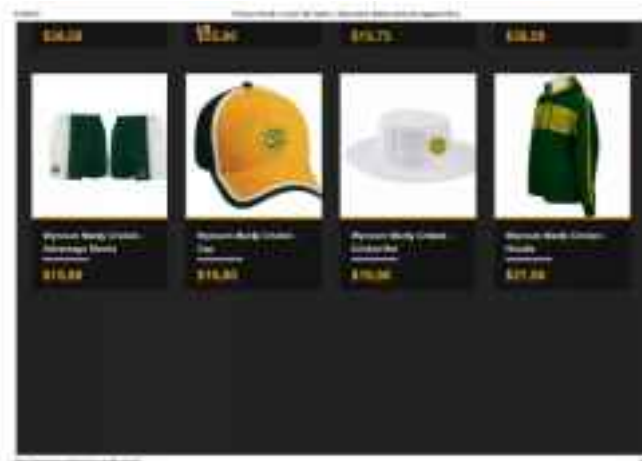
